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Purpose

1. This briefing seeks your endorsement of the University of Auckland-led bid for New Zealand to host the Asia-Pacific Association for International Education (APAIE) Conference and Exhibition 2021.

Asia-Pacific Association for International Education

- 2. APAIE was established in South Korea in 2004 by 13 university representatives from across the Asia-Pacific region. It has expanded to become a thriving association. APAIE's objectives are to encourage greater cooperation between institutions, to enrich and support international programmes, activities and exchanges, and to promote the value of international education across the region and beyond.
- 3. APAIE seeks to bring together international educators, universities and related organisations active in Asia-Pacific higher education to promote communication, networking and professional development. It facilitates the exchange and mobility of students, staff and scholars and the progression of academic collaboration interregionally. APAIE strives to promote best practice and policy in cooperation with various institutions and agencies, to support benchmarking to advance institutions, and to represent and promote the Asia-Pacific region's views on international education to the rest of the world.
- 4. Each year, the conference attracts around 250-300 exhibitors and approximately 1,600-2,000 delegates from 45 countries. Attendees network, improve their professional skills and learn about new developments in international education. Attendees include international education policy makers, practitioners and experts from around the world.
- 5. The 2018 conference is being held in Singapore on 25-29 March and the 2019 conference will be held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

Unsuccessful 2020 bid

- 6. In November 2017, Auckland competed with Vancouver, Canada to host the 2020 conference. The University of Auckland-led Auckland bid was unsuccessful, with the decision made in favour of the British Columbia Council of International Education coordinating the event in Vancouver.¹
- 7. In summary, the 2020 bid was unsuccessful due to:
 - a. a very competitive British Columbia bid which included supporting scholarships initiatives, a supporting cast of eight co-host universities and a committed implementation plan including the venue organiser attending the presentation.
 - b. an Auckland-focused bid was led by the University of Auckland that did not include formal co-hosting by other New Zealand universities as other New Zealand universities have tended to focus on their engagement with the United States rather than the Asia-Pacific region.

8. Questions were also raised by the assessment panel around the preparedness of the Auckland Convention Centre to host a conference in 2020, following its opening in 2019.

Bid for Auckland to host the 2021 conference

- 9. The University of Auckland has been leading the development of a more compelling New Zealand bid to host the 2021 conference in Auckland, with support from Education New Zealand (ENZ) and the other seven New Zealand universities.
- 10. The 2021 conference bid includes:
 - a comprehensive New Zealand offering, with seven formal co-hosts supporting Auckland as the lead host
 - planned partner academic days at New Zealand universities to foster academic exchange and increase the benefits of hosting the conference
 - central and local government support including from Auckland Tourism, Events and Economic Development (ATEED), the Auckland Mayor and ENZ
 - commitments by New Zealand universities to be more active participants in the APAIE network which is the Asia-Pacific region's pre-eminent forum for international education collaboration and exchange.
- 11. New Zealand would be well prepared to host a conference of this size with the new Auckland Conference Centre opening in 2019 and New Zealand hosting APEC in 2021². The 2021 conference would be tentatively scheduled for the last week of March 2021. The University of Auckland has signalled that the conference date could be shifted if it would clash with the America's Cup final³.
- 12. Japan is understood to be also planning to bid to host the 2021 conference.

Benefits of hosting the 2021 conference

13. ENZ is supportive of the 2021 conference bid as:

- it would highlight the importance of international education in New Zealand's relationships with the Asia-Pacific region as it would be among a series of Asia-Pacific international events hosted in New Zealand in a 12-18 month period
- the conference would be attended by up to 2,000 leading educators and education professionals from across the Asia-Pacific region
- the conference would provide an opportunity to showcase New Zealand, New Zealand's education system and its international education offering and New Zealand's universities
- the conference would grow New Zealand's education linkages across the Asia-Pacific region

- the attending delegates would spend up to a week in New Zealand, providing significant tourism and regional development opportunities
- engagement between New Zealand educators and APAIE members⁴ would be strengthened before, during and after the conference which raise New Zealand education's profile in seven of ENZ's priority markets.

Draft letter from the Minister of Education

14. ENZ recommends that you sign the letter as a formal endorsement of the bid because:

- your letter will strengthen the chances of New Zealand being awarded the hosting rights and realising the benefits of hosting the conference
- Ministerial endorsement of the bid would substantially strengthen the endorsements being provided by the eight university Vice-Chancellors, Auckland Mayor and ENZ.
- 15. The initial bid needs to be submitted by 28 February 2018 to APAIE for assessment.
